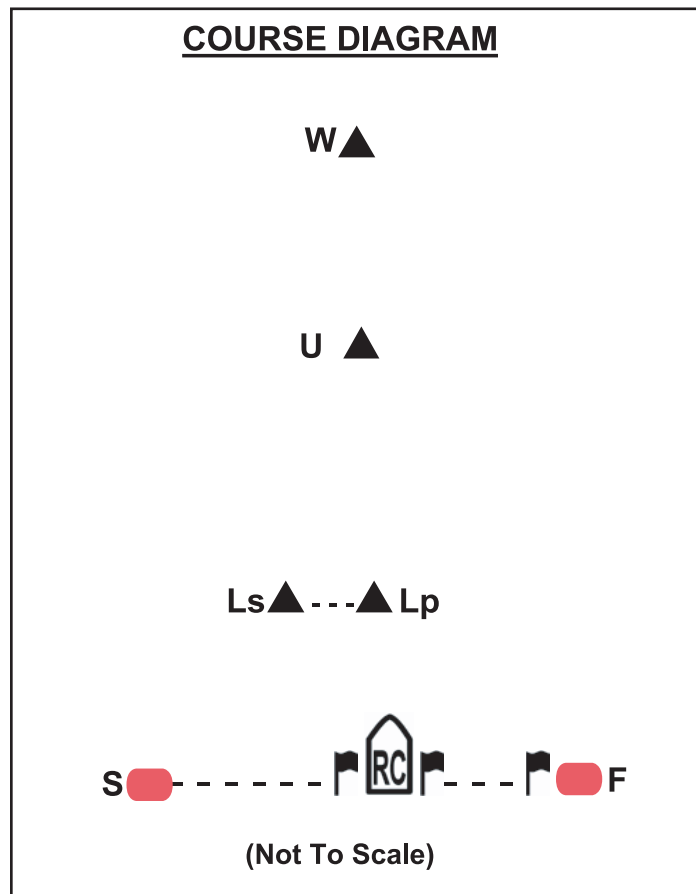

1. **RULES:** The races will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing, 2005-2008, the rules of the classes and Series entered, and these sailing instructions.
2. **NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:** Any Notices to Competitors will be posted on the outdoor bulletin board on the southwest wall of the SCCYC Clubhouse not later than 0930 hours each day.
3. **SCHEDULE:** Three races are planned for Saturday, and two are planned for Sunday. The Chuck Stein Series will have two races on Saturday. The warning signal for the first race each day shall be at 1155 hours. Classes will be started at five-minute intervals. Subsequent races will start as soon as practical after the last race in the previous sequence.
4. **CLASSES:** Classes, class flags, and the order of class starts will be posted on the outdoor bulletin board on the southwest wall of the SCCYC Clubhouse not later than 0930 hours on Saturday, July 21st. Classes with five or more boats will be given a separate start. The Race Committee may combine starts of classes with less than five boats.
5. **COURSES:** Races will be sailed north of and adjacent to the Yellow MdR Racing Buoys on windward/leeward courses.
 - 5.1 Marks W and U shall be rounded to port.
 - 5.2 Boats shall sail between Marks Ls/Lp (the gate) from the direction of mark W or U, and round Mark Ls to starboard or Mark Lp to port. In the event only one leeward mark is on station that mark shall be rounded to port.
 - 5.3 Prior to the Preparatory Signal for each class, the course number and the approximate magnetic bearing to the first windward mark will be signaled by code flags on the RC boat. This changes RRS 27.1.
 - 5.4 Marks W and U will be one Nm and one-half Nm respectively from Ls and Lp. The starting/finishing lines will be approximately 0.1 nautical mile to leeward of Marks Ls/Lp.
 - 5.5 Courses will be signaled by a number flag as shown below:

COURSE

FLAG	COURSE	DISTANCE
2	Start – W – Finish	2.2
3	Start – W – Ls/Lp – U – Finish	3.2
4	Start – W – Ls/Lp – W – Finish	4.2
5	Start – W – Ls/Lp – W – Ls/Lp – U – Finish	5.2
6	Start – W – Ls/Lp – W – Ls/Lp – W – Finish	6.2



6. **MARKS:** Marks W and U will be either orange or yellow inflatable tetrahedron shapes. Any new windward mark, W or U, as provided in SI 9, will be the alternate color to the previous mark..
 - 6.1 Marks Ls and Lp will be yellow or orange inflatable tetrahedron shapes..
 - 6.2 Mark S and F will be cylindrical orange inflatable shapes.
7. **START/FINISH LINE:** The Start line will be between a cylindrical orange inflatable on the Port side of the Race Committee Boat and an orange flag on the Race Committee Boat. The Finish line will be between a cylindrical orange inflatable on the Starboard side of the Race Committee Boat and an orange flag on the Race Committee Boat.
