

Notice of Race

2006 2 for 1 Sail Man/Woman #4
Saturday, October 21st, 2006
Marina del Rey, California



Rules: This series will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2005-2008, the prescriptions of US Sailing, the one-design class rules, this Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions, and any Amendments and Notices issued by the Race Committee. The 720-degree penalty turn is modified to one 360-degree turn that shall include one tack and one gybe. This modifies Rule 44.2.

Classes: Classes are PHRF Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker. Three or more one-design boats will also be scored for the race, but class scoring will be used for the event and series.

Eligibility: See "2006 Marina del Rey Man/Woman Series" Notice. Open to members of clubs of SCYA or US Sailing, using PHRF-rated or one-design boats.

Entries: Crew must be one man and one woman only. Submit an entry form to SCCYC by 9:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 21st.

Fees: The entry fee is \$18 (\$15 for US Sailing members). Checks should be payable to SCCYC. Race entries may be deposited in the race entry box (mail box) on the southwest wall near the bottom of the stairs to the SCCYC Clubhouse at 13445 Mindanao Way, Marina del Rey, CA 90292.

Skipper's Meeting: SCCYC will host an informal Skippers' Meeting at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, October 21.

Sailing Instructions: Sailing Instructions will be available at SCCYC no later than 0930 hours on Saturday, October 21.

Starting Time & Location: The first race will start at 1200 hours, with the Warning Signal at 1155 hours in the vicinity of "S" mark. Two races are planned.

Courses: Courses will be chosen from Marina del Rey Course Chart #16 and/or possible courses identified in the Sailing Instructions, and will be sailed on the Marina del Rey buoys outside the Mdr Breakwater.

Scoring: Low-Point Scoring System, Appendix A, with no throw outs, will be used.

Trophies: Trophies will be awarded at SCCYC following the last race.

Hospitality: Saturday morning - Coffee and donuts at 9:00 a.m.; Saturday afternoon - Refreshments, No-Host Bar, and Awards Ceremony.

Sailing Instructions

- RULES:** This series will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing for 2005-2008, the prescriptions of US Sailing, the one-design class rules, the Notice of Race, these Sailing Instructions, and any Amendments and Notices issued by the Race Committee.
- NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:** Any Notices to Competitors will be posted on the outdoor bulletin board on the southwest wall of the SCCYC Clubhouse not later than 0930 hours.
- SCHEDULE:** An informal Skippers' Meeting will be held at SCCYC at 9:30 a.m. the day of the race. Two races are planned. The warning signal will be at 1155 hours. Races will be started at five-minute intervals. Subsequent races will start as soon as practical after the last race in the previous sequence.
- CLASSES:** Classes, class flags, and the class starting sequence are as follows:
 - Spinnaker Red Sleeve Shape** 
 - Non-Spinnaker Yellow Cone Shape** Three or more one-design boats will also be scored as a class for this event, but not for the series.
- COURSES:** Races will be sailed on or near the MDR Racing Buoys. Courses will be selected from the Marina Del Rey Course Chart No. 16 and other courses as may be provided in addenda to these instructions. Letter and number code flags will be displayed on the Committee Boat to indicate the class to start and the course to be sailed.
- MARKS:** Permanent marks are as described on the course chart. Rule 34(b) is changed: U-Mark and substitute marks will be orange, inflatable cylinders or tetrahedrons.
- START/FINISH LINE:** The Start/Finish line will be between "S" Mark and an orange flag on the Race Committee Boat.
- STARTING SYSTEM:** Races will be sailed in accordance with Rule 26, with warning signals at five-minute intervals.
- COURSE CHANGES:** Rule 33 is changed: The race committee may change course at any rounding mark by displaying Code Flag C over a letter code flag with repeated sound signals to indicate a new weather mark. The next and all subsequent marks of the course will be referenced to the new weather mark. If the C flag appears without class flags, it affects all classes; otherwise, class flags will designate the classes for which the course is changed. If the C flag is over the 5 Flag, the next mark of the course will be the finish line.
- EXCEPTIONS:** Rule 44.2 is changed to a 360-degree turn including one tack and one gybe.
- TIME LIMIT:** Boats finishing after 1600 will be scored DNE.
- PROTESTS:** The Race Committee shall be notified of intent to protest at the finish line of the race in which the protested event occurred. Protests must be filed at SCCYC within one hour of the Race Committee return to the Clubhouse.
- SCORING SYSTEM:** The Appendix A low-point scoring system will be in effect, except all races will be counted. This changes A2. Scoring will be based upon the total number of races started and not abandoned by the Race Committee. Three boats must finish or withdraw to complete a race.
- CHECK IN:** Contestants are requested to check in prior to the first warning signal, and to notify the Race Committee if they leave the course during racing.
- RADIO COMMUNICATIONS:** The Race Committee will monitor VHF channel 68.
- PRIZES:** Trophies will be awarded at the SCCYC Clubhouse after racing is completed on Saturday. Trophies will be awarded as follows:

3-4 entries: 1 trophy	12-16 entries: 4 trophies
5-7 entries: 2 trophies	17+ entries: 5 trophies
8-11 entries: 3 trophies
