## NOTICE OF RACE

The Sunstroke Series Sponsored by D.I.S.C. Sports and Spine Center will be hosted by South Coast Corinthian Yacht Club (SCCYC) each Thursday from May 6 through August 26, 2009. SCCYC is located at 13445 Mindanao Way, Marina del Rey, CA 90292 USA. Information about SCCYC and this series is available at [www.sccyc.org](http://www.sccyc.org).

### 1. RULES

- 1.1 This series will be governed by the rules as defined in the *2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 The Organizing Authority (OA) is SCCYC.
- 1.3 The Sound-Signal Starting System of RRS Appendix S will be used, except that there will be no Warning Signal and the Starting Signal for one class will be the Preparatory Signal for the next.

### 2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Classes have been established for Lido 14, Coronado 15 and Laser. Other dinghy classes with at least three (3) boats desiring a start must contact the Series Chairman in advance.
- 2.2 Each entrant must be a member of a yacht club or sailing association that is a member of US SAILING (or their own National Authority).
- 2.3 To be eligible to compete in any race of the series, competitors must complete and sign a SCCYC Entry Form and submit an entry fee prior to 1700 hours on the evening in which they first compete. **Competitors under eighteen years of age must have their entry form signed by a parent or guardian.**

### 3. FEES

The entry fee for each evening is \$6 for members of US SAILING with proof of membership (\$7 for non-members). The series entry fee is \$45 for single-handed classes and \$65 for double-handed classes for members of US SAILING, \$10 more for non-members. For competitors under 18 years of age, the series entry fee is \$30 for single-handed classes and \$45 for double-handed classes. ### 4. SCHEDULE

- 4.1 Races are scheduled each Thursday evening from May 6 through August 26, for a total of seventeen (17) evenings.
- 4.2 The Starting Signal will be at 1800 hours for the first race each evening with five (5) races scheduled. The Race Committee (RC), at its discretion, may run fewer races.

### 5. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available at the bottom of the stairs at SCCYC beginning Thursday, May 6 and may be posted at [www.sccyc.org](http://www.sccyc.org).

### 6. VENUE

The race area will be in the entrance channel of Marina del Rey between the two lines of "No Sail" buoys.

### 7. COURSES

Courses will be primarily windward / leeward.

### 8. SCORING

- 8.1 Each evening's races will be scored as provided in RRS Appendix A using the Low Point System, except that all scores will count. RRS A9 will apply with the following modification: a boat that did not come to the starting area shall be scored points for the finishing place two more than the number of boats that came to the starting area.
- 8.2 This series will be scored as provided in Appendix A of the RRS using the Low Point System, counting each boat's final standing from each evening as a single score, excluding her worst three final standings. For the Lido Fleet, July 15 standings will be excluded.
- 8.3 A competitor who has entered a boat in the series and serves on the RC shall receive as a series score, for that one evening only, points equal to first place (thus, for series standing purposes only, there will be two boats with first place points for that evening's races). A boat may only receive such points once during the series.

### 9. PRIZES

Prizes for each evening will be awarded at SCCYC as soon as possible after racing. Trophies for the series will be awarded on Thurs, Aug. 26.

### 10. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers (organizing authority, host yacht club, race committee, protest committee, sponsors, and any others acting in an official capacity for this event) from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
